### Winterfest 2015 Boat Parade

This year's theme is "Fairy Tales Afloat"





The Boat Parade will stage on the New River in downtown Fort Lauderdale, along the docks west of Stranahan House to the Broward Center for the Performing Arts. The Parade travels East to the Intracoastal Waterway as it continues North to Lake Santa Barbara in Pompano Beach. It's 12 Miles of the "Greatest Show on water"

Private boats to the giant showboats and corporate mega-yachts will be adorned with hundreds of thousands of lights, music, entertainment, decorations, celebrities, musical groups, beauty queens and many other exciting entries expected to be viewed by over one million spectators. Parade highlights: Grand Marshal Showboat (Floridian Princess), Galleria Mall Reindeer Barge and the Baptist Health Santa Showboat.

Since June, our club has had a string of water related activities. Let us finish the year with a grand finally. Please plan to join the action and the fun.

Our SSSF spectator fleet will raft-up at Sunrise Bay which is just north of the Sunrise Bridge and the Coral Bay Yacht Club. Pat O'Brien's M/V "Irish Rose" will be the lead anchor boat. It has been suggested that all the power boats in the fleet anchor stern to the ICW and parade route. Sailboats can anchor bow to the ICW and secure the raft from swinging due to changes in the current or wind.

### Captain's Log

### Capt. Kelly Dobbs

My marine career started in Northern Minnesota at the tender age of 8 at my family's 5 cabin fish camp. My job was mowing the lawn, cleaning fish and helping guest enjoy their stay, (I'm told I was very entertaining). I was paid \$0.10 cents a fish, which was more than enough income to purchase 6 gallons of gas and a quart of outboard oil a week.

My first boat was built by myself. It was a sailboat. I used an old door, tied two inner tubes to the underside. I got in trouble for using a broom handle, (I cut off a handle on a new broom) for the mast and a sheet I took off the laundry line. I did not know about a boom, sheets (other than for a sail) or a keel. But I set out to deep water and drifted until my grandmother was looking for me and my grandfather found me in the middle of the lake adrift. I was towed in and in trouble, (again).



My first power boat was a 14' fishing boat, powered with a 7.5 outboard. I was in my glory, cruising more than fishing. My older brother had a NACRA 5.0 cat that was real fast and real sailing.

After High school I tried collage at Fergus Falls JC, also known as Frost Bite Falls, MN. Remember, that is where Rocky and Bullwinkle went to school. I skipped a semester and was promptly drafted into the US Army. 4 days into my military service a big drill sergeant ask me what MOS (job training) I wanted and looking at this big board of schools, behind the sergeant, I said "Watercraft Operator, I'll take that one. The sergeant laughed and said sign here for an extra 4 years and I will make sure you get to that school. I will pass on the offer.

Well, after basic training I was amazed to be sent to Ft. Eustis, VA where I started Deckhand school for the US Army. My platoon sergeant pulled me aside and whispered in my ear, "Decline the next school, everyone who went to the next school and graduated, were shipped out to Vietnam and took command of a river boat. River boats were also know as sitting duck or target ducks with short life spans. I finished my 1 year, 5 months, 25 days and 13 hours in the service in Virginia Beach, VA, Ft. Story. I'm one lucky Vietnam era Vet, never served in Vietnam.


I moved to Florida in 1986 to follow a dream of being an Offshore Power boat Racer. But, became the manager of a series of boatyards including Old Port Cove and Rybovich and then with Rybovich Spencer.

Later I became a member of the marine industries Assn of Palm Beach, served on the board and later, president. Next, my dreams come true and went Offshore Power Boat Racing. I became the President of the Palm Beach Grand Prix Offshore Power Boat Festival. That was amazing and educational to say the least.

I have two World Speed records in Super Light Tunnel Boat class and a second place sail boat racing in a beer can race just recently.

4 years ago I heard thru a friend that a sailboat was sunk in his marina and is totaled. He suggested I call the insurance company and buy it, fix it up, and live on it. I did just that. Well after 5 weeks of phone tag, I got a call from a supervisor who said " YOU WILL BUY ITAS IS, WHERE IS, NO STRINGS? Yes I said. "How much?." She said \$1,000.00. I said on my way to your desk NOW! Now you know why my boat is called "The Grand." I have spent many more grand to date but, it is all worth it.

My next big adventure is joining the SSSF Board as Owners Rep. Then February 9, 2016 sail from Miami to Havana, in a SORC Race. And as Paul Harvey would say, "now you know the rest of the story."


